# We Need Your Medical Expertise

Consultants have an important role in the investigative process.

The Board relies upon its Consultants to provide unbiased, expert opinions.

Although not bound by a Consultant's review, all reviews are given consideration as part of the entire case file.

All investigation materials are made available via secure electronic means whenever possible.

It is the Consultant's duty to maintain *confidentiality* of the case's information and integrity before, during and after the case ends. The Board is obligated to investigate any allegation that falls within its jurisdiction and those falling within the Osteopathic Practice Act.

#### Compensation

Consultants are paid per case review.

After receiving a physician's response to a Consultant's report involving alleged deviations to the standard of care, you may be asked to provide a supplemental report.

Consultants receive an additional stipend for the supplemental report. MD Consultants may also claim one
(1) hour of CME credit for every hour spent completing a case review.

#### **Qualifications**

Hold an active license to practice medicine (MD or DO) in Arizona and have NO prior Board disciplinary history.

Practice in the same or similar area as the physician under investigation. (Please note: You will be required to disclose any potential conflicts, should they exist.)

Are NOT the subject of an existing investigation, pending disciplinary action, or final action by any licensing agency or health care entity.

AND... you have been practicing medicine for at least five (5) years.

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
